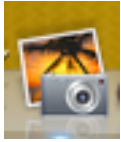


Click on the iPhoto icon on the doc:



If you have pictures already on iPhoto they will come up as events



HINT:

If you want to change a name for an “EVENT”, double click on the title here and type in the new one

Click here to see all your photos organized by event

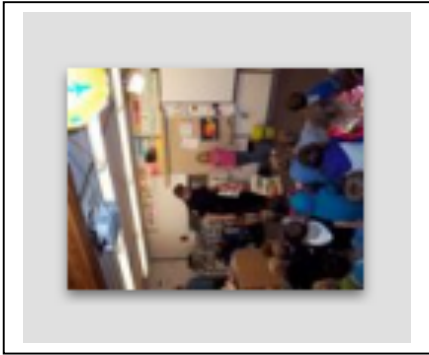
Click here to see all your photos

When you click on an event it will expand to show you all the photos in the event

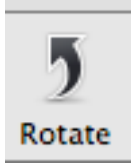


Rotating a sideways picture:

1. Select the picture you want to rotate by clicking on it (it will have a yellow box around it when it is selected)

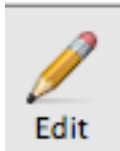


2. Then click on the ROTATE button until it is the way you want it

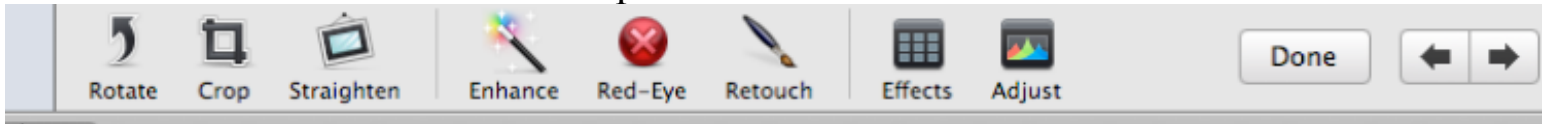


How to edit a photo:

1. Select the photo you want to edit then click on the EDIT button



2. There are a number of different options to choose from



← click her to move to the next photo in the set

← click her to move to the pervious photo

← click when you are done editing

← adjust color, contrast and exposure

← add some artistic effects to photos

← Remove blemishes on a face

← reduce or remove redeye

← Auto edit your picture

← took a cockeyed pic? Straiten it out

← change the canvas size

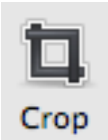
← rotate a picture

Crop a picture:

Here is the original



1. Click on the CROP button



2. A box will form within the photo – this is your new frame



3. grab a corner to adjust the size

4. Click and hold the center to move the box

5. To keep the picture a standard size, click the CONTRAIN box and select a size from the drop down menu; your window will adjust to your constraints

6. When you have the desired size and focus of the picture click apply
7. If you are unsatisfied even after you have cropped a picture you can go back to crop and resize from the original

Straighten a photo:

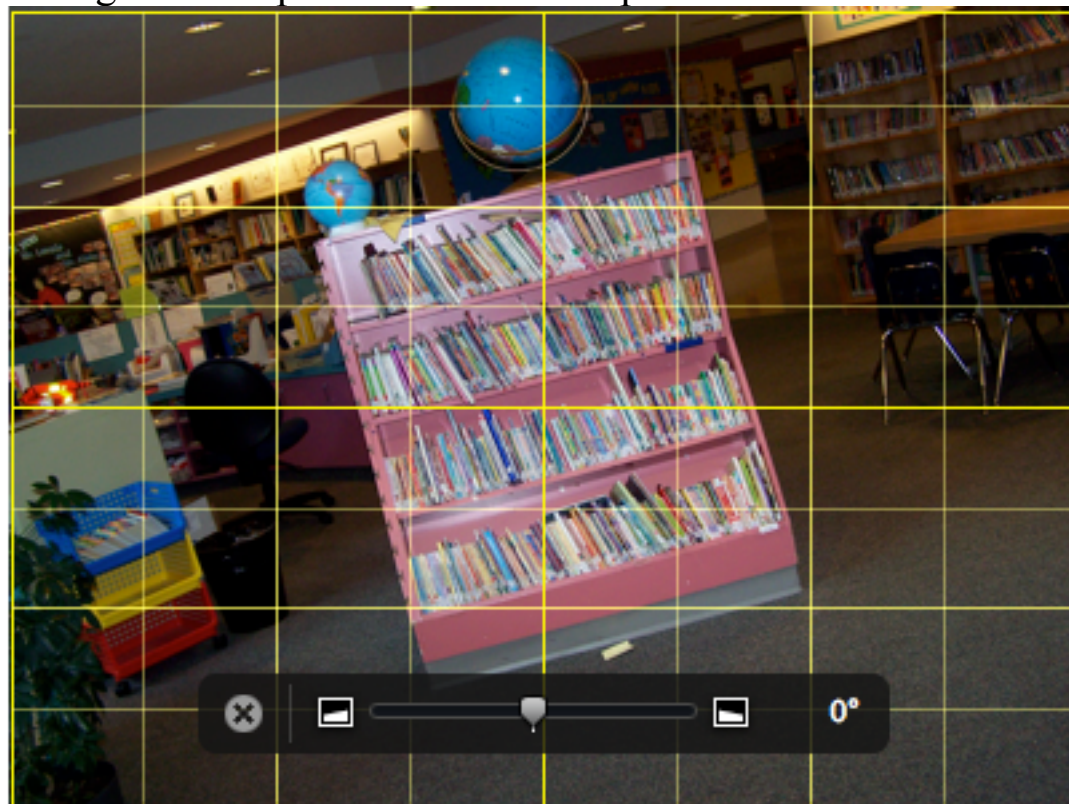
Here is my original



1. Select the photo you straighten and click on the STRAIGHTEN button



2. A grid and a pull bar will come up



3. Grab the drag tab and move it to the desired position then click done



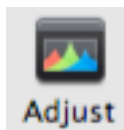
How to adjust the colour and contrast:

Here is the original

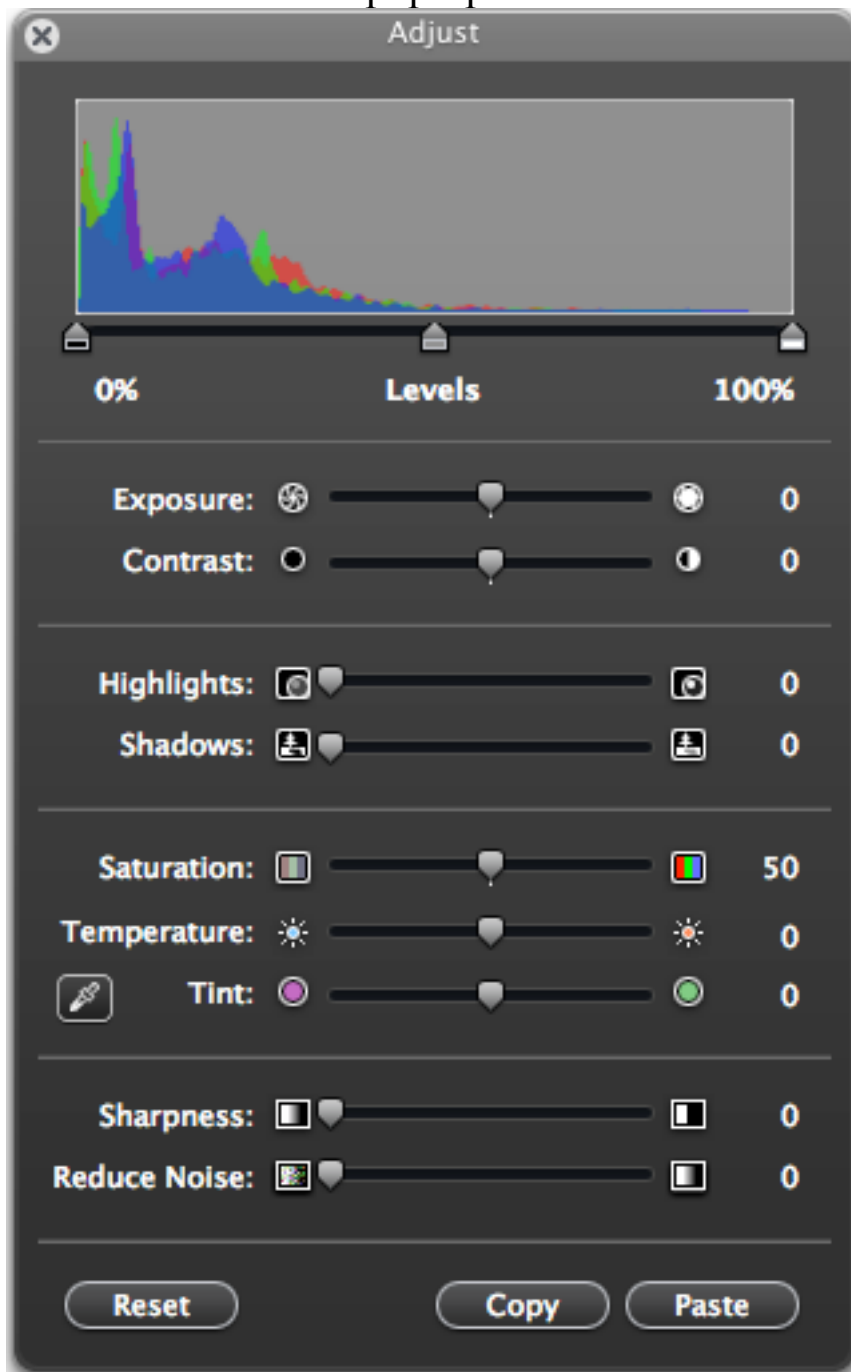


1. Looking at the picture it is a little to dark (there is also red-eye but lets fix the colour first)

2. Select the photo and click on the adjust button



3. This window will pop-up



← adjust colour by level percentages (this is complicated so I rarely use this)

← Adjusts the amount of light

← Adjust the contrast between colours

← make objects stand out more

← Make the shadows more distinct

← increase the amount of colour

← Add more blue or red tones

← Add more pink or green tones

← Sharpen the image (kinda works for slightly out of focus pictures)

← Reduce noise (good for scanned pictures that have bits on it)

4. Play with the dials until you reach a desired effect; click PASTE then click DONE

Fixing red-eye:

1. Still using the same picture as above; select photo and click on RED-EYE button



2. A option menu will come up



3. Do as it says – click on the red-eye to remove the devilish look

4. NOTE: use automatic as manual usually turns out bad

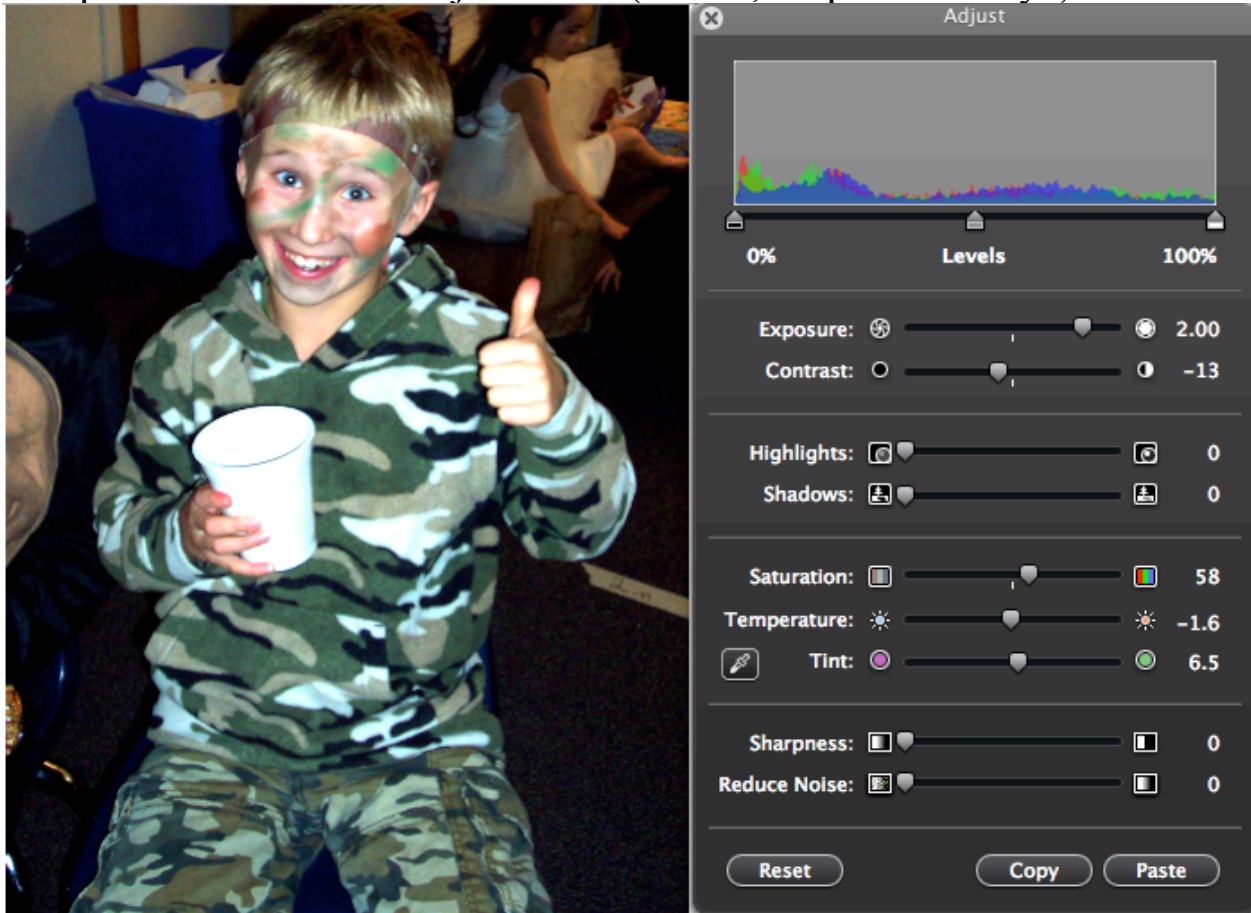




The picture after all the adjustments (colour, crop and red-eye)



Importing pictures:

1. When you first connect a camera to your computer, it will ask you if you want to use iPhoto whenever you connect click on YES
2. So now when a camera is connected iPhoto will automatically start
3. All the photos and videos on the camera will show up and the following menu will be below them

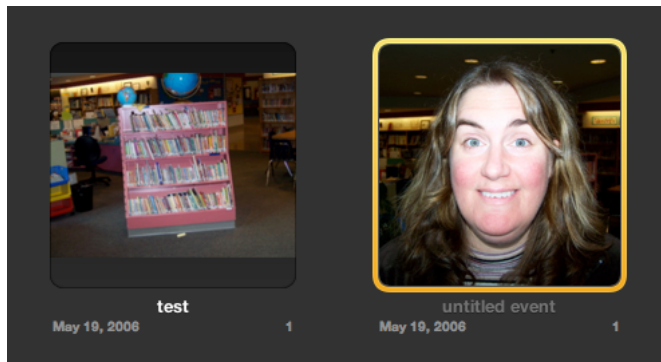

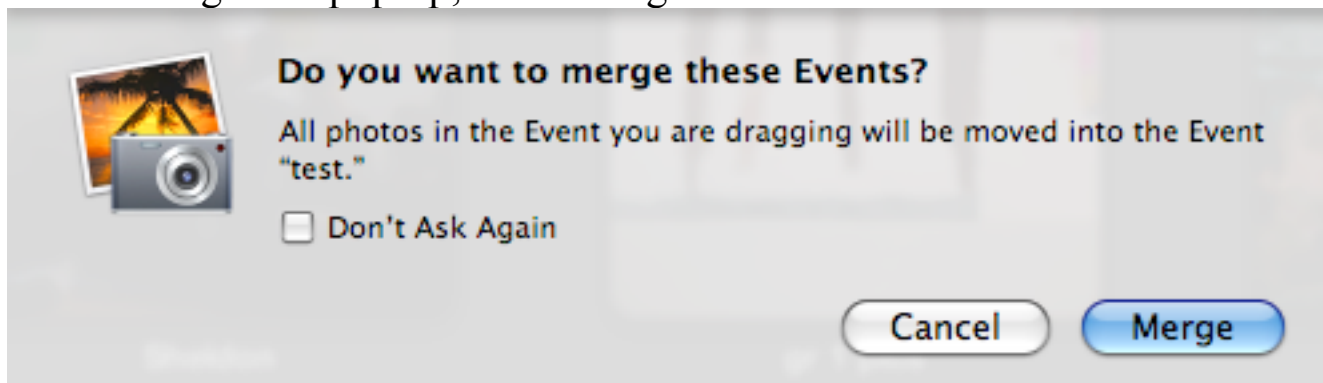
4. If you want all the photos in their unorganized state just click IMPORT ALL
5. If you want to organize the photos select the photos that you want to put together then under the heading EVENT NAME type in a title (i.e. Halloween); click on IMPORT SELECTED
6. After the photos and videos are imported it will ask you if you delete the originals; it is a great courtesy to delete them off of school cameras; on personal cameras that is up to you.

Combining Events:

1. If you have two events that you want to combine, select one of the events and drag it to the other



2. A message will pop-up; select merge



NOTE: the event that is **not** moved will retain its name
